## **Position Summary**

The Regional Manager is a critical field leadership role for the CarePortal (CP) Platform. This leader serves as an expert responsible for assessing and continuously improving the health of the platform ecosystem in assigned counties. The Regional Manager identifies and develops Requesting Agency and Implementing Partner (IP) relationships, facilitates local collaboration across church and agency networks in their community, and oversees the management of the local CarePortal ecosystem to maximize the ability of churches of all types to serve vulnerable children and families. The role requires relational and operational strengths to drive collaboration across ministry partners, denominations, neighboring communities and child serving agencies.

## **Main Responsibilities (including but not limited to)**

### **Implementing Partner and Requesting Agency Relationships**

- Identify and cultivate relationships with a variety of Christian ministries and non-profits whose ministry effectiveness may be strengthened by becoming an Implementing Partner
- Build and maintain strong relationships with child serving agencies reaching diverse populations across the Houston metro
- Mobilize, train, and provide local support to IP leaders and agency staff across the metro area

### **Local Collaboration Efforts**

- Grow child serving capacity of the Church through building a strong ecosystem of ministry and community partners
- Facilitate Active Community gatherings and cross-network opportunities for greater impact
- Work collaboratively with Partners and Agencies to increase Church engagement and to serve more children and families

### **County Ecosystem Health Management**

- Drive quantitative and qualitative improvement in key ministry metrics throughout the metro area, using CarePortal's County Health Assessment Dashboard (CHAD) and other tools to inform performance

- Maintain an effective balance between the supply and demand of requests and responses through the platform
- Regularly consider and make recommendations for ministry innovations and CarePortal platform improvements
