POSITION SUMMARY

The Regional Manager (RM) is a critical field team member of The Global Orphan Project's domestic ministry and the CarePortal (CP) Platform. This leader serves as a local expert responsible for assessing and continuously improving the health of the CP's ministry ecosystem in Dodge City, Hays, and Western Kansas. Specifically, the RM will (a) help identify and develop agency and partner relationships to enter the needs of at-risk local children and families into the CP system; (b) help develop and provide ongoing support to a local network of engaged churches who will meet the needs of the vulnerable, walking with them at the point of care, and (c) engage other businesses and individuals in community partnerships and financial sponsorships for the benefit of children and families. The role requires relational, operational, and managerial strengths to drive collaboration across partner ministries, denominations, and child welfare agencies.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES (INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO)

Implementing Partner and Requesting Agency Development

- Maintain strong relationships with child serving agencies and develop new requesting agency partnerships within the region
- Recruit, train, and support local church partners as they serve local children and families in need
- Cultivate relationships with a variety of Christian ministries, businesses and nonprofits that may become partners
- Augment existing revenue streams to ensure ministry sustainability in Kansas

Partner and Agency Support

- Mobilize, train, and support participating churches and agencies in the region
- Drive quantitative and qualitative improvement in key ministry metrics
- Work collaboratively with partners and agencies to increase Church engagement and to extend ministry reach
- Regularly recommend ministry innovations and platform improvements to the Global Ministry Support team
